Upon the attached certified copy of a judgment of the County Court, Nassau County, rendered on the 23rd day of December, 1958, convicting said Francis E. Dec, an attorney and counselor at Law admitted by the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court, Second Judicial Department, on the 31st day of March, 1954, of the crimes of forgery, 2nd degree, and grand larceny, 2nd degree, felonies, and the said certified copy of said judgment having been presented to this court by the County Clerk of the County of Nassau on the 29th day of December, 1958, and pursuant to subdivision 4 of Section 90 of the Judiciary Law, it is

ORDERED that the said Francis E. Dec, be and he hereby is disbarred and removed from the office of attorney and counselor at law of the State of New York as of the date of entry of this order, and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that the name of said Francis E. Dec be struck from the roll of attorneys and counselors at law of the State of New York, and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, pursuant to the appropriate provisions of

the Judiciary Law of the State of New York, that the said Francis E. Dec is hereby commanded to desist and refrain from the practice of law in any form, either as principal or as agent, clerk or employee of another, and is forbidden to appear as attorney or counselor at law before any court, judge, justice, board, commission or other public authority or to give to another an opinion as to the law or its application, or any advice in relation thereto.
